Pneumococcal Conjugate Vaccine, 20 Valent

Medicare began covering Pneumococcal conjugate vaccine, 20 valent on October 1. CMS suggests submitting separate claims for this vaccine (HCPCS code 90677).

- Part A Medicare Administrative Contractors (MACs) will hold these claims until the April 2022 system update
- Part B MACs began processing these claims on October 4
- CMS will deny claims for vaccines provided July 1–September 30 (before it was covered by Medicare)

DATA 2000 Waiver Training Payments Still Available for Rural Health Clinics

HRSA continues to <u>accept applications</u> for payment from Rural Health Clinics (RHCs) employing buprenorphine-waivered providers under the Drug Addiction Treatment Act of 2000 (DATA 2000) Waiver Training Payment Program.

The program gives RHCs the opportunity to apply for a \$3,000 payment for each eligible employed provider who attained a DATA 2000 waiver on or after January 1, 2019. Approximately \$1.5 million in program funding remains available for RHCs and will be paid on a first-come, first-served basis until funds are exhausted.

HRSA is collaborating with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to process these applications. For more information, the program provides a <u>video</u> and <u>FAQs</u>.

An <u>Office of Inspector General report</u> found that Medicare improperly paid for non-physician outpatient services provided shortly before or during inpatient stays.
