

# CMS EPCS Program Declared Disaster Exception Fact Sheet 2023 Measurement Year Declared Disasters

#### **UPDATED: 06/18/2024**

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) Electronic Prescribing for Controlled Substances (EPCS) Program declared disaster exception was established to support prescribers affected by natural disasters and public health emergencies. Prescribers affected by certain circumstances will be granted an automatic exception by CMS. This fact sheet addresses the automatic declared disaster exception for the 2023 measurement year. This fact sheet will be updated if additional events are identified that trigger the declared disaster exception or if there are changes to previously identified events.

## The CMS EPCS Program Declared Disaster Exception

The CMS EPCS Program declared disaster exception is automatically applied to prescribers identified as located in a CMS-designated region affected by a disaster (such as a <a href="Federal Emergency">Federal Emergency</a> Management Agency (FEMA)-designated major disaster or Secretary of <a href="Health and Human Services">Health and Human Services</a> determined public health emergency) for the measurement year\*. For eligible prescribers, we aim to reduce burden by eliminating the need to submit a waiver request and granting an automatic exception for the entire measurement year.

We identify CMS EPCS Program eligible prescribers in CMS-designated areas that have been affected by a disaster based on the practice and mailing addresses associated with the prescriber in the Provider Enrollment, Chain, and Ownership System (PECOS) or National Plan and Provider Enumeration System (NPPES). Prescribers who are automatically identified will be granted an exception for the entire measurement year.

We make every effort to accurately identify all prescribers who are eligible for this exception. Prescribers should ensure that the mailing and practice address listed in PECOS and NPPES are current to ensure the declared disaster exception is applied correctly.

As of the time of publication of this fact sheet, we are applying this exception to prescribers in the following designated areas:

- Certain counties in Mississippi for the Mississippi severe storms, straight-line winds, and tornadoes: Mississippi: DR-4697-MS
- The U.S. territory of Guam for the Guam Typhoon Mawar: Guam: DR-4715-GU
- Certain counties in Hawaii for the Hawaii wildfires: Hawaii: DR-4724-HI
- Certain counties in Florida for Hurricane Idalia: Florida: DR-4734-FL
- Certain counties in Georgia for Hurricane Idalia: Georgia: DR-4738-GA

<sup>\*</sup>For the 2023 measurement year, the <u>national COVID-19 Public Health Emergency (PHE)</u> is also on the Declared Disaster list.



## **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### How do I find out which areas are designated by CMS as being affected by disaster?

#### How can I confirm that I received the CMS EPCS Program declared disaster exception?

Starting September 16, 2024, you can check your exception status on the <u>CMS EPCS</u>
 <u>Prescriber Portal</u> to ensure the policy was applied correctly.

#### What happens if I'm granted the CMS EPCS Program declared disaster exception?

• If you are granted a declared disaster exception, you have met the CMS EPCS Program requirement regardless of the percentage of your qualifying Medicare Part D controlled substance prescriptions sent electronically in the measurement year.

## What should I do if I'm eligible for the CMS EPCS Program declared disaster exception, but the exception wasn't applied?

- If you believe that you qualified for the automatic declared disaster exception, but don't see the exception reflected on your status in the CMS EPCS Prescriber Portal, CMS recommends the prescriber request a waiver for circumstances beyond the prescriber's control via the Portal.
- The waiver application period, via the CMS EPCS Prescriber Portal, is open for 60 days. For the 2023 measurement year, the waiver application will be available at 10 a.m. ET on September 16, 2024, and will close at 8 p.m. ET on November 18, 2024. CMS will also provide technical assistance for waiver requests via telephone for prescribers who cannot apply for their waiver online.
- The CMS EPCS Program waiver is specific to the federal program only. Please check to see if your state has separate requirements for electronic prescribing for controlled substances, including waiver requirements.



## What should I do if I was impacted by a disaster outside of those identified for the CMS EPCS program?

 If you were unable to meet the CMS EPCS Program requirement due to a disaster outside of those identified for the CMS EPCS Program, CMS recommend the prescriber request a waiver for circumstances beyond the prescriber's control via the Portal.
