New for Medicare in 2025

Good news! Starting in 2025, you won't pay more than \$2,000 for your covered prescription drugs in a year. You can also choose to spread out your out-of-pocket prescription drug costs over the calendar year. Review your plan to make sure it covers your drugs and meets your needs and budget. <u>https://go.cms.gov/drug-coverage-cap</u>

Medicare plans change from one year to the next. Next year, all Medicare prescription drug plans will include a yearly \$2,000 cap on your out-of-pocket drug costs. The cap only applies to drugs covered by your plan. So, it's more important than ever to make sure your drugs are covered. Review and compare all your health and drug options and see if you can save. <u>https://go.cms.gov/drug-coverage-cap</u>

Starting next year, your yearly out-of-pocket costs for Medicare drug plancovered prescription drugs will be capped at \$2,000. You can also choose to spread your out-of-pocket costs across the calendar year instead of paying all at once at the pharmacy. Review your plan to make sure it covers what you need: https://go.cms.gov/drug-coverage-cap

Plans change every year. With the new yearly \$2,000 cap on covered out-ofpocket drugs and the option to spread your prescription costs across the year, it's even more important to review and compare your health and drug plan options. Medicare will never call to ask for your Medicare Number, unless you contact Medicare first. If an unknown caller contacts you during #MedicareOE and asks for your Medicare Number, hang up and call 1-800-MEDICARE, or visit www.medicare.gov/basics/reporting-medicare-fraud-and-abuse.

<u>Medicare.gov</u> is the official source for Medicare information! During Open Enrollment, you may be coming across a lot of information from other sources. Start at Medicare.gov to get unbiased information to find the type of coverage that best meets your needs.

Getting Extra Help with Medicare Drug Costs

If you make less than \$23,000 per year (\$31,000 for married couples), you might qualify for Extra Help. It could cut your Medicare Part D drug costs to no more than \$4.50 for generic prescriptions and \$11.20 for brand-name drug prescriptions. Find out if you qualify: https://go.medicare.gov/ExtraHelp

Extra Help is a Medicare program that can pay for your drug coverage (Part D) premiums, deductibles, coinsurance, and other costs. If you make less than \$23,000 a year (\$31,000 for married couples), it's worth it to apply! Visit <u>https://go.medicare.gov/ExtraHelp</u> to learn more.

Due to a new law, more people qualify for more prescription drug savings with Extra Help. So, it could pay to apply, even if you don't think you qualify or were denied before. To apply, visit <u>https://go.medicare.gov/ExtraHelp</u>.
