I. SUMMARY OF CHANGES: The purpose of this Change Request (CR) is to update the National Correct Coding Initiative (NCCI) Procedure-to-Procedure (PTP) edits. This recurring update notification applies to Chapter 23, Section 20.9.

II. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Background: The purpose of this Change Request (CR) is to update the National Correct Coding Initiative (NCCI) Procedure-to-Procedure (PTP) edits. The attached recurring update notification applies to Publication 100-04, Chapter 23, Section 20.9.

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) developed the National Correct Coding Initiative (NCCI) to promote national correct coding methodologies and to control improper coding that leads to inappropriate payment in Part B claims.

The latest package of NCCI Procedure-to-Procedure (PTP) edits, Version 31.1 effective April 1, 2025, will be available via the Hybrid Cloud Data Center (HCDC). A test file will be available on or about January 31, 2025, and a final file will be available on or about February 14, 2025.

Version 30.3 will include all previous versions and updates from January 1, 1996 to the present. In the past, NCCI was organized in two tables: Column One/Column Two Correct Coding Edits and Mutually Exclusive Code (MEC) Edits. In order to simplify the use of NCCI edit files (two tables), on April 1, 2012, CMS consolidated these two edit files into the Column One/Column Two Correct Coding edit file. Separate consolidations have occurred for the two practitioner NCCI edit files and the two NCCI edit files used for the Outpatient Code Editor (OCE). It will only be necessary to search the Column One/Column Two Correct Coding edit file on its website for either practitioner or outpatient hospital services, since all active and deleted edits will appear in the single Column One/Column Two Correct Coding edit file on each website. The edits previously contained in the Mutually Exclusive edit file. Refer to the CMS NCCI webpage for additional information at https://www.cms.gov/medicare-medicaid-coordination/national-correct-coding-initiative-ncci/ncci-medicare.

B. Policy: The coding policies developed are based on coding conventions defined in the American Medical Association's Current Procedural Terminology manual, national and local policies and edits, coding guidelines developed by national societies, analysis of standard medical and surgical practice, and review of current coding practice.
