- \*October 7- The White House Initiative and President's Advisory Commission on Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders Announces Helen Beaudreau as New Executive Director. Krystal Ka'ai appointed Member of the President's Advisory Commission on Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians, and Pacific Islanders. \*October 10- HHS Office for Civil Rights Secures Agreement with the State of Maryland to Make Programs More Accessible for Persons with Disabilities. The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), Office for Civil Rights (OCR) secured a settlement agreement (Agreement) with the State of Maryland to protect the civil rights of persons with disabilities. The Agreement is based on federal civil rights laws, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Section 504) and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (Title II of the ADA).

As of October 6, 2024, Rwanda has reported 49 cases and 12 deaths from MVD.
