



NATIONAL NURSE-LED CARE CONSORTIUM (NNCC)

Association Membership	NNCC's network includes over 250 nurse-managed health centers, 16,000 nurses (APRNs, RNs, BSNs) and other clinical staff, and more than 11,000 FQHCs.
Key Assets Promoting Practice Transformation	NNCC offers training services in the form of live online workshops, peer learning collaboratives, webinars, and self-paced content tied to critical principles of nursing. Examples include the online SAFE Opioid Prescribing Series and live workshops to promote the adoption of a patient-centered, team-based care models.
Bringing Transformation to Professional Sector	The nursing sector can be a driver of high-performing practice transportation and NNCC is preparing nurses for that role. Nurse-led care exists at the intersection of multidisciplinary healthcare, where nurses have a transformative role as holistic caregivers, advocates, and leaders. Exemplary performance in the field of nurse-led care is defined by nurses working within the full scope of their licensure as part of a team, embracing principals of nursing (e.g., care coordination, service integration), to engage patients, families and communities to deliver evidence-based, whole-person care. Examples of NNCC's transformative impact include:
	 <u>Training Workshops</u>: Twenty-on in-person training workshops focused on care teams, care coordination, and PFE delivered to 152 practices across 13 states. Practices report a 4 percent improvement in uncontrolled diabetes. <u>SAFE Opioid Prescribing Series</u>: How to safely and effectively treat pain in primary care six-part podcast module series with materials and references for download. Clinicians have logged over 3,700 completions and 8,800 CE hours earned. Of survey respondents, 43 percent of participants increased the use of state PDMPs and 58 percent increased the use of opioid care plans for their opioid patients.
Supporting PTNs and Other Partners	To support PTNs in accelerating the pace of transformation in TCPi, NNCC has provided training and resources related to team-based care, care coordination, patient engagement, and more. NNCC delivered 12 training interventions in concert with PTN partners reaching 860 TCPi-enrolled clinicians and staff.
	NNCC works with PTN partners to collect and report on improvements in measures related to nurse-led care such as chronic disease management, patient utilization, and cost savings. NNCC and training partners have seen significant improvements in uncontrolled diabetes, asthma management, ED utilization, and

cost-savings to the system.





Supporting Movement to Value-based Care	NNCC identified critical principles of nursing that drive high-performance and are associated with successful adoption of APMs, including education, training, and assessment of readiness to transition to an APM. NNCC advocates for the role of nurse leaders as key to preparing practice to enter into an APM.
	The NNCC Lunch n' Learn webinar series brings monthly webinars to NNCC's 16,000+ TCPi listserv members, 82 percent of whom are NPs, for discussion of TCPi content and free CE. NNCC has hosted over 50 webinars over the past three years and currently averages roughly 700 attendees per webinar. Understanding of and preparation for value-based payment (VBP) is a major objective of the series. In a survey of participants, 80 percent said participation contributed to their understanding of VBPs, 73 percent said it improved their capacity to succeed in VBPs, and 69 percent said it boosted their intention to engage in VBP.
Promoting Exemplary Practice	NNCC believes that exemplary practice is defined as nurses who are given the opportunity to work to the highest-level afforded by their license. NNCC advocates for an exemplary nurse-led practice that is committed to nurse-leadership, coordinates patient care, adopts interdisciplinary care team, and engages with patients and families.
	NNCC identified several high-performing nurse-led practices and identified critical elements that defined their success, and how other practices (nurse-led and otherwise) could adopt these principles to succeed. High-performing practice stories identified include VBP transition for sole providers, practice sustainability for small, rural practices, and person-centered care design. NNCC will continue to identify exemplary practices utilizing nurse-led care, and share tools and resources with their greater professional network.
