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#### I. GENERAL INFORMATION

**A. Background:** Currently, the Medicare Administrative Contractors (MACs) release beneficiary MSNs from the quarterly hold file based on historical information of how many claims were related to a particular range of zip codes. On occasion the actual number of MSN claims awaiting release by zip code range produces unexpected MSN volumes that may strain the data centers, print centers and mail processing facilities. The MSN zip code analyzer tool will allow the MACs to evaluate the impact of the zip code ranges being selected and determine an optimal zip code range selection.

The Interactive System Productivity Facility (ISPF) tool is designed to aid the MACs in analyzing beneficiary MSN zip codes used in releasing claims held on the quarterly MSN hold file. The zip code analyzer tool will allow the MACs to determine how many MSN claims and the Health Insurance Claim Number will be released based on a specific zip code range. The tool will provide the MACs the ability to control the volume of claims released through input of a starting zip code range, along with the desired number of claims to be released. The tool will provide the ending zip code range to release the number of claims specified. The benefit of using the tool is that it provides the MACs the ability to evaluate the impact of selecting zip code ranges based on actual MSN claim information.

The use of the tool is optional for the MACs. This change allows the MACs to more efficiently manage the release of the quarterly MSNs through data-driven analytics rather than relying on historical data for projecting likely MSN volumes, mitigating potential strain on the Virtual Data Center resources, as well as the MACs' print and mail operations.
