## I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. Background: As a Title XVIII contractor, WPS currently processes a Part A workload that in the past had been processed by Mutual of Omaha and which includes providers who fall under the geographic jurisdiction of all 15 Part A and Part B Medicare Administrative Contractor (A/B MAC) jurisdictions. This is known as the WPS Legacy workload. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) must transition all Title XVIII workloads to a MAC by October 1, 2011. WPS workloads have previously been transitioned to the Jurisdiction 1 and Jurisdiction 4 A/B MACs, and a third transition is planned for the Jurisdiction 12 A/B MAC on February 21, 2011.

The CMS requires that daily CMS-1522 data be sent to the Production Performance Monitoring System (PULSE). While it is CMS's preference to produce all reports by State, it is not possible for the Fiscal Intermediary Shared System (FISS) to do so for the purposes of PULSE reporting when multiple workloads reside in a single Customer Information Control System (CICS) region. Accordingly, CMS has determined that such data should be reported A/B MAC wide.

The purpose of this CR is to instruct the FISS maintainer to develop and incorporate into its base system programming that will merge the WPS Legacy output at any transitioned A/B MAC with all of that contractor's existing CMS-1522 daily PULSE reports.
