I. GENERAL INFORMATION

- A. Background:** The purpose of this change request is to notify all interested parties that the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) needs to change the contractor workload numbers for the for South Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia Part A & Part B workloads, the North Carolina Part B workload, and the Regional Home Health Intermediary (RHHI) Region C workload when those workloads are transitioned to the J11 A/B MAC. These changes are being made because CMS needs to identify each workload by state using a standardized numbering system. These workloads shall be transitioned to the J11 A/B MAC as indicated below.

The North Carolina Part A workload was transitioned to the J11 A/B MAC as per Change Request (CR) 7000.

The effective date of all Part A transitions will fall on Monday, but the effective dates of the Part B transitions will fall on a Saturday. This is necessary to accommodate the software that will be used to create and populate the new Part B CICS production regions.

The West Virginia Part B workload is currently processed in the same CICS region as the Ohio Part B workload. In order to accomplish this transition, CMS will need to split these workloads into two different CICS regions. CMS will simultaneously transition the Part B Ohio workload to the J15 A/B MAC if practical. If that is not practical, the Part B Ohio workload will remain with the legacy contractor in a separate set of CICS regions.

The South Carolina Part A and RHHI-C workloads are processed in the same CICS region, as are the Virginia and West Virginia Part A workloads. We **will not** need to split these CICS regions. However, we **will** need to assign these providers to separate MAC workload numbers.

Quality Software Services Inc. (QSSI), the Single Testing Contractor (STC) utilizes multiple stand-alone CICS regions at the PGBA corporate data center which use a number of different legacy contractor workload numbers, including 00380 and 00880. As part of the transition of these workloads, QSSI, PGBA, and the appropriate shared system maintainers will need to determine how best to transition these environments to reflect the J11 MAC environment. We have included a number of business requirements to effectuate whatever changes are deemed necessary.
